Annex to the Declaration on the Elimination of Violence against Women

Every year, 1.5 billion women and girls are at risk of violence.

Violence

Violence against women and girls is a global public health problem that causes significant physical, psychological, and economic harm. It is a violation of human rights and a barrier to the achievement of the Millennium Development Goals. The Commission on the Status of Women, in its 54th Session, adopted the Declaration on the Elimination of Violence against Women, which defines violence against women and girls as any act of violence that results in or is likely to result in physical, sexual, or psychological harm or suffering, including threats, coercion, or deprivation of liberty. The Declaration also identifies the various forms of violence against women and girls, including intimate partner violence, sexual violence, and violence against women and girls in the community. The Declaration calls for the elimination of violence against women and girls and for the adoption of measures to prevent violence and to provide support and services to victims.
