Faculty Affairs Committee Meeting 12:30-2:00ish PM attempted to claim rights over the intellectual property of an adjunct instructor who was developing a course through the EPIC workshop series. The instructor received notification that the university was claiming intellectual property rights 11 weeks after she had begun to develop the course. The issue was resolved this time only when the dean agreed to strike out the intellectual property claim language from the instructor's appointment letter. We discussed how the issue of who owns course materials will continue to be an issue, especially for adjunct faculty who are vulnerable and exploited. Mark gave us an administrative perspective that was helpful:
